MRC and Fuel Tax

The MRC Pontiac recently unanimously passed a resolution supporting our request for the Minister of Revenue to declare the Pontiac a border region and reduce the fuel tax accordingly. This resolution was followed by a letter from our MNA, Charlotte L'Ecuyer, also to the Minister, requesting the same.

Our meetings continue and the Fuel Tax committee, led by Tom Orr, is now beginning planning on our next steps. Your Chamber has committed itself to reducing the 10% difference in our fuel prices as compared to Ontario. We know that doing so will reduce the amount of cross border spending and help all businesses in the Pontiac.

A bright future for Rail

Chamber President Jim Thompson was fortunate to be invited to take part in Rail day on October 5th. This joint venture between our local SADC and agencies from the Ontario side as well as Ottawa Central Railway was determined to showcase the potential for rail service through the Valley. Leaving from Walkley Yards in Ottawa the train moved through beautiful countryside to Norway Bay. After a lunch stop at Norway Bay Golf Course it was on to Beachburg. At both stops the train was met by enthusiastic supporters. The Chamber fully supports this transportation initiative and looks forward to helping the Ottawa Central Railroad build the Pontiac.
